January - February 2023 Expenditure Report

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I INTRODUCTION

This report presents an analysis of central government expenditure from January 1st – February 28th, 2023. The purpose of this report is to inform all relevant stakeholders on the composition of Government Local Fund (GLF) expenditure for the period under review highlighting in particular, the expenditure rates of different Budget Entities (BEs) and different budget line items.

This report also indicates prior year comparatives and spending patterns. It should be noted that all expenditure herein refers exclusively to GLF denominated in Gambian Dalasi (GMD) and does not factor any donor sourced funding including external loans and donor project grants. Key things to note;

- 1. The overall GLF expenditure as at end February is 16% of 2023 GLF budget.
- Personnel Emoluments and Subventions to Public Corporations (32% and 24% respectively) constitute the highest expenditure classes during the period. 57% of the total February allocation went to these two.
- Capital expenditure accounted for 14% of total expenditure compared to the 24% of January.
- 4. Ministry of Basic and Secondary Education has registered the largest consumption rate of 18% as at end February 2023.

II TOTAL GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURE

Government's total expenditure for the months of January and February (Jan-Feb) amounted to **GMD 3.48 billion** as compared to **GMD 3.69 billion** during the same period last year, representing a **6% decrease** in cumulative GLF spending.

This overall downward trend is attributable to negative Year-on-Year (Y-o-Y) growth in Subventions (-15%) and Capital Development spending (-60%).

<u>Table 2</u> compares the actual spending by economic class against the Approved 2023 National Budget, highlighting the expenditure rates. A total amount of GMD 1.11 billion has been spent on Personnel Emoluments (PE) expenditure as at end February 2023 against its approved budget of GMD 6.10 billion representing a 18% spending rate.

For Other Recurrent expenditure, an amount of GMD 5.39 billion has been approved, and a total

amount of GMD 608.97 million was spent, representing a 11% absorption rate. Moreover, Subventions amounting to GMD 3.70 billion have been approved, and a total amount of GMD 846.60 million has been spent, representing a 23% expenditure rate. Debt Service expenditure amounting to GMD 4.30 billion has been approved, and a total amount of GMD 416.17 million has been spent, at a rate of 9.7%. Meanwhile, Capital expenditure amounting to GMD 2.50 billion has been approved and a total amount of GMD 497.76 million has been spent on infrastructure development projects representing an absorption rate of 19.8%.

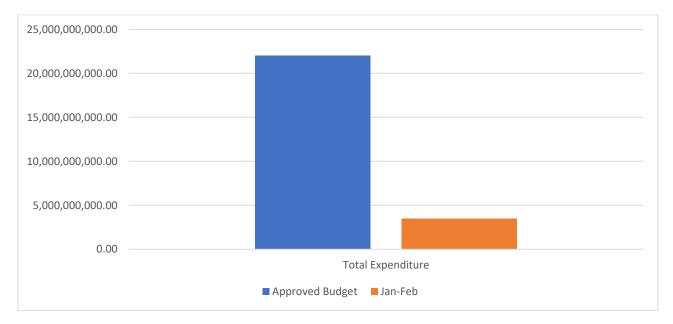


Chart 1: Total GLF Expenditure for Jan-Feb, Compared to Approved 2023 Budget

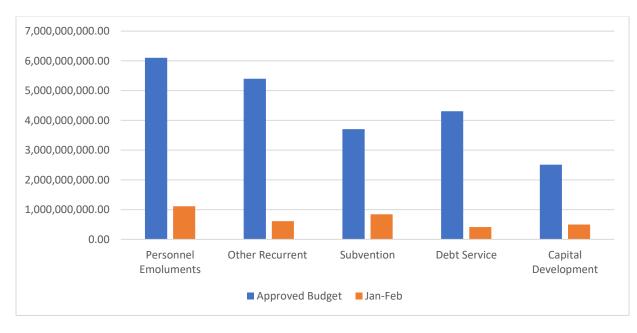


Chart 2: Budget Class Expenditure for Jan-Feb Compared to Approved 2023 Budget

During the period under review, total PE increased by 36 % to reach GMD 1.11 billion compared to GMD 818.78 million from the same period last year. Basic Salary has consumed 50% of Total PE, registering a 48% Y-o-Y. Allowances have consumed 43% and registered a 22% Y-o-Y. ECA has consumed 7% of Total PE, increasing at a rate of 55% Y-o-Y. Finally, Social Security Contributions have increased in absolute value to GMD 666,972.20. representing an increase of 253% Y-o-Y.

This overall increase in PE may be attributed to the 30% increase in Basic Salary from the Revised 2022 Budget and also the introduction of the two new Ministries – the Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy, and the Ministry of Public Service, Administrative Reforms, Policy Coordination and Service Delivery.

<u>Table 3A</u> details the Approved 2023 Budget for PE as compared to end February expenditure. ECA has accounted for 24% of its approved budget. Basic Salary and Allowances have both accounted for 18% of their respective budgets. There has been no expenditure on the Civil Service Staff Loan for Jan-Feb. Social Security Contribution expenditure has increased to 3% in the month of February. In total, PE accounted for 18% of its approved budget.

III. Top Spending Budget Entities (BEs) in Jan-Feb

The Ministry of Basic and Secondary Education is the highest spending BE, consuming 18% of total expenditure for the period under review. This is followed by the Ministry of Transport and Debt Service both consuming 12% of total expenditure. These ten BEs, including the National Debt Service account for GMD 3.00 billion of total expenditure for end February 2023, representing 86% of total expenditure for the period under review

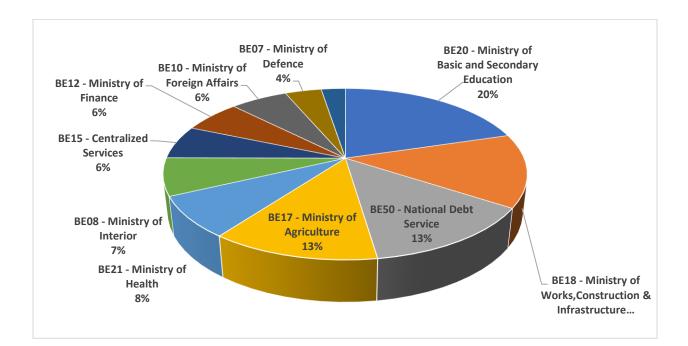
It is important to note here that Input Subsidy is now expensed by the Ministry of Agriculture, as compared to last year, when it was expensed by the Centralized Services.

IV. Top Spending Budget Lines

Subvention is the highest spending budget line during the period under review, with expenditure amounting to GMD 846.60 million, and corresponding to 23% of its approved 2023 budget. This is followed by Debt Services with an amount of GMD 416.17 million at 10% of the approved 2023 budget.
